Any instances of non-compliance will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis and any remedial actions tailored appropriately.

To help facilitate compliance with these policies a worldwide, confidential, independent helpline is in place which employees, contractors and suppliers may contact to report any issues they are concerned about.

This statement has been approved by the Board of Directors, who will review and update it as necessary on an annual basis.
